





The Starnes Class was formed in the 1950's by Mrs. Ernestine Starnes who was a special needs public school teacher. She felt strongly about offering a Sunday School class at her church that offered the love of Christ and addressed the needs of developmentally disabled students. She graciously did this, along with the assistance of several other women in the church, for about 20 years. At that point she recruited Nancy Nutt, Pat Schweitzer, Betsy Allen, Henrietta Adams, and Mary Penn Sherlin to lead the class. Jerry Lachapelle played the piano for their song time for about 30 years. As the years have gone by, many other church members have taught, offered snacks, and transportation for Starnes Class members.

As Doug Gill became more involved with the ARC of the Triangle, and learned of other people who wanted to attend the class, he began offering transportation, mostly to those who lived in group homes. At first he used his car to drive all over Wake County to pick folks up. Later, when the church acquired a bus, he filled it up each Sunday, often making several rounds to make sure those who were interested, had a way to get there.. Since his route was so long, he began taking students to Wendy's after church before taking them home. This excursion was a joyful highlight to their week.

During the time of Covid when the class could not meet, Doug and the Starnes Class teachers kept in contact with the students. It became apparent how deeply they missed the class and how much it was a lifeline for each one of them. Many of them have no contact with family members and very little opportunity for fellowship. The church became their family.
